## Load in your Vehicle First – Unload Last at the Event

Load in your vehicle	ITEM	ACCEPTED	NOT ACCEPTED	NOTES
<b>1st</b>	SCRAP METAL, APPLIANCES	Barbecues, microwaves, cast iron sinks and tubs, dishwashers, lawnmowers, stoves, hot water heaters, washers & dryers.	No cars, trailers, greasy metal.	Please drain all liquids, "(gas, oil, etc.)" and remove any plastic or rubber from metal.
<b>2nd</b>	REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS, AIR CONDITIONERS	Household refrigerators and freezers, household air conditioners.	No commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.	
<b>3rd</b>	MATTRESSES, PROPANE TANKS, AND PORCELAIN	Mattresses, box-springs, toilets, sinks & ceramic tiles		
<b>4th</b>	ELECTRONICS, TV's and PHONES	Computers*, monitors*, laptops*, keyboards, scanners, printers, fax machines, power supplies.	No mice accepted.	*Free to recycle year round through E-Cycle Washington 1-800 RECYCLE. 
<b>5th</b>	BATTERIES – LEAD ACID AND HOUSEHOLD / ALKALINE BATTERIES	Car, truck, marine lead acid batteries. Pre-sort large quantities; Household alkaline batteries	No rechargeable batteries	Rechargeable batteries can be taken to sites listed under: <a href="http://www.rbrc.org">www.rbrc.org</a> where they are collected for free.
<b>6th</b>	PETROLEUM PRODUCTS	Motor oil, diesel fuel, 2-cycle mix, transmission & brake fluid, kerosene, antifreeze and oil filters.	No spent gasoline. Spent/old gas can be taken to the Roving Wastemobile. No unmarked or mixed liquids.	Do not mix liquids together. Containers must be properly sealed.
<b>7th</b>	TIRES	On or off rim light truck, car and motorcycle tires	No tires with an inner circle diameter greater than 18."	Biased, steel-belted & studded tires accepted
<b>8th</b>	FLUORESCENTS	Fluorescent bulbs or tubes	No lighting fixtures or broken tubes.	Limit of 10, .Double bagged please; Up to 10 fluorescent bulbs also accepted at the Roving Wastemobile
<b>Load Last</b>	CLOTHING & HOUSEHOLD ITEMS	Reusable items that work: clothing, shoes, bedding, pots, books, small appliances, & toys.	No broken, torn, stained, wet items. No furniture, carpet or mattresses.	Stained, torn, or badly worn textiles can be recycled through Threadcycle. Visit <a href="http://www.kingcounty.gov/threadcycle">www.kingcounty.gov/threadcycle</a>

**PLEASE DO NOT BRING:** any household paint, pesticides, or household chemicals – take to the Snoqualmie/North Bend **Household Hazardous Wastemobile @ MSHS Freshman Campus on July 10-12 from 10 am–5 pm.** LATEX paint must be dried out & put in the garbage with lid off.
